Phishing

If someone calls, texts, emails, or mails you asking for your personal information—e.g., social security number, credit card number, bank account info, passwords—**DO NOT GIVE IT TO THEM**.

Even if they appear to be a known company or claim to be from a trusted source, they may be scamming you in order to steal your identity or money. This is known as **phishing**.

Make sure to carefully consider whether the link you have been sent is authentic.

You may want to independently reach out to the business or agency on your own terms using a known phone or website instead of accepting the unsolicited contact. Most legitimate companies will not contact you this way asking for personal information.

How To Recognize Phishing

Scammers use email or text messages to try to steal your passwords, account numbers, or Social Security numbers. If they get that information, they could get access to your email, bank, or other accounts. Or they could sell your information to other scammers. Scammers launch thousands of phishing attacks like these every day — and they're often successful.

Scammers often update their tactics to keep up with the latest news or trends, but here are some common tactics used in phishing emails or text messages:

Phishing emails and text messages often tell a story to trick you into clicking on a link or opening an attachment. You might get an unexpected email or text message that looks like it's from a company you know or trust, like a bank or a credit card or utility company. Or maybe it's from an online payment website or app.

The message could be from a scammer, who might

- say they've noticed some suspicious activity or log-in attempts they haven't
- claim there's a problem with your account or your payment information there isn't
- say you need to confirm some personal or financial information you don't
- include an invoice you don't recognize it's fake
- want you to click on a link to make a payment but the link has malware
- say you're eligible to register for a government refund it's a scam
- offer a coupon for free stuff it's not real

Need Your Help


A few years ago, the City of Fort Worth went to a common prefix (392) for city phone numbers.

Crime-Free Multi-Housing

The Crime Free Multi-Housing Program is a state-of-the-art, crime prevention program designed to reduce crime, drugs, and gangs on apartment properties.

The program consists of 3 phases that must be completed under the supervision of the Fort Worth Police Department. Property Managers, Assistant Managers, and Leasing Agents can become individually certified after completing training in each phase and the property becomes certified upon successful completion of all 3 phases.

Property Managers, Assistant Managers, and Leasing Agents authorized to execute a lease with prospective tenants in a complex with 8 or more units must attend an 8-hour training within 6 months of hire date. The landlord or at least one employee for the complex shall attend a 4-hour refresher training annually. (Fort Worth City Ordinance No. 19998-12-2011)

Attendees must pre-register for the workshop. To register, contact Officer Brittany Jones at CFMH@fortworthtexas.gov or complete form at CFMH Registration Form.

Workshops will be held in the auditorium of the Fort Worth Police Department's Headquarters, located at 505 W. Felix St on Wednesdays from 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. or 9:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. for refresher training.

Once submitted, the request will go directly to the appropriate team for a quick response.


The user can view the status of the request in the app and receive a notification when it is complete.



Alarm Permits

What you need to know

If you live within the Fort Worth City limits and have a Monitored Home or Business Alarm System, you are <u>required to obtain an Alarm Permit</u> (Chapter 12 Fort Worth city Code)

Permits must be <u>renewed annually</u>. The Planning and Development Department will send out reminder notices, either by email or Postal Mail, about one month prior to the permit expiration date. However, you are responsible for ensuring that you renew your permit.

There are 3 ways you can apply for or renew the Alarm Permit.

- ⇒ In person; City of Fort Worth Planning and Development Department, 1000 Throckmorton
- ⇒ By Mail: You can download an application by going to: http://fortworthtexas.gov/planninganddevelopment/permits/alarms/.
- ⇒ Online: Go to http://fortworthtexas.gov/planninganddevelopment/permits/alarms/ and select "New Alarm Permits" or "Pay for an existing permit or service fees".

Applying or renewing Online is very easy. For first timers, you will need to register first and establish an account. Once you are registered, you can then apply for the permit.

Before applying for the Alarm Permit, make sure you have your paperwork from your Alarm Service. There is information that will be required for the permit process. Make sure you fully complete the application process, including paying online.

After you complete the application process, you will receive an email that confirms the application has been received. Once it is approved, you will receive your Alarm Permit information. This process is actually pretty quick. Make note of your Alarm Permit number—You will need this when you renew your permit. You can also always access your account and obtain this information.

Permit and Service Fees

Homeowner Permit Fee: \$50.00 initial and Annually Commercial Permit Fee: \$100.00 initial and Annually

1-3 false alarms in 12 months - No Charge

4-5 false alarms in 12 months - \$50 per call

6-7 false alarms in 12 months - \$75 per call

8 or more false alarms in 12 months - \$100 per call

The Chief or authorized designee shall refuse police response to any alarm notification from an alarm site that does not have a valid alarm permit unless the alarm notification is a duress alarm, a hold-up alarm, a panic alarm or a report to 911 emergency telephone or to the police department by a person other than an alarm company.

The City of Fort Worth is partnering with Deaf Link to provide the Accessible Hazard Alert System (AHAS) which will send accessible alert messages to registered residents who are Deaf,

Blind, Hard of Hearing, or Deaf/Blind before, during, and after an emergency or disaster in the City of Fort Worth.

Fort Worth AHAS subscribers in an area affected by an emergency or disaster will be able to receive an accessible alert message in American Sign Language (ASL) and English voice and text. The alert message could include information about the emergency and what actions to take.

Fort Worth AHAS will send accessible alert messages to internet and video capable devices such as computers, cell phones, smart phones, tablet computers, and wireless Braille readers.

Crime Stoppers hotline, 817-469-TIPS (8477), and website are operated by the Safe City Commission Crime Stoppers Call Center. The call center is staffed by off-duty public safety dispatchers and other trained personnel, who take calls and online submissions and then disseminate the tip information to the appropriate law enforcement agency for investigation. Each caller will receive a tip number to be used in all future correspondence.

Every tipster remains ANONYMOUS; callers do not have to identify themselves. A reward of up to \$1,000 will be offered to anyone who provides a tip that leads to an arrest for a crime or a criminal case cleared.
