

#### SYSTEM REPORTING LIMITATIONS

- Information includes data pulled into the IAPro system as of 01/31/2021.
- Incidents entered into BlueTeam are given a received date based on when the person entered information about the event. The following reports are based on cases with a noted received date between 01/01/2020 and 12/31/2020.
- Use of Force reports are made on all incidents where an officer used force on a citizen.
   The report itself does not mean any administrative violations occurred. If a use of force is flagged for possible violations, it is duplicated into an administrative investigation and the use of force report will be notated with that fact.
- In some cases, reports are entered with incomplete information. Incomplete data is shown in these reports under the label of "No Data".
- Other unique reporting challenges or interpretation guidelines for individual reports are noted in the explanatory textbox on each report page.
- As with all information collection systems, the quality of data entered affects the quality of data reported. In addition, FWPD enters reports on an incident and citizen based reporting systems.



# **Use of Force**


### **Use of Force Reporting Requirements**

The Fort Worth Police Department requires an administrative Use of Force report on all use of force incidents which result in injury to any person, involves the use of a physical control method that includes a strike or the grounding/takedown of a subject, or any use of a weapon to control a subject shall be reported and identified as "Use of Force". The Use of Force Report is reviewed by the Officer's Supervisor, Use of Force Review Board and through the entire chain of command up to the Assistant Chief of Police. The Use of Force is reviewed to ensure the use was appropriate and within the guidelines of department policy and law. If the officer used force inappropriately, a departmental investigation is required and the officer may receive additional training or in some cases discipline up to and including termination from employment.


## Use of Force Comparison Year/Year

During 2020, there were 334 reported Uses of Force compared to 453 during 2019. This represents a 26% percent decrease.

- o The total number of UOF incidents for 2020 is 334.
- The total number of officers involved in at least one UOF incident in 2020 is 575 (Involved Officer or Assist Officer to the UOF).
- o The total number of citizens involved in a UOF for 2020 is 334.
- The total UOF incidents in 2020 fell from 453 in 2019 which is a 26% decrease.
- o The total number of uses of Deadly Force is 5 a 50% decrease compared to 2019 at 10.
- Use of Force data used for this report is based on 334 UOF incidents. 23 UOF incidents were still under review by the chain of command as of the data collection date (01/14/2021)







\* The **2020 UOF by Gender** chart shows the breakdown of UOF by the Gender of the involved officer in relation to the total number of officers employed.





























Total Use of Force Incidents by Citizen Race chart is the total number of the citizens involved in a use of force incident broken down by the involved citizen's race.




Demographics for the City of Fort Worth based on the 2020 US Census estimate.




Citizen Injury and Arrest charts depict the percentage of time a citizen was arrested and or injured during a Use of Force Incident.






\* The *Officer Assessment of Citizen Condition* chart shows the perceived condition the citizen was in during the time of the use of force.










# Administrative Cases


- The total number of Administrative Cases for 2020 is 366 cases that the chain of command investigated or Internal Affairs.
- Internal Affairs in June of 2020 began tracking every complaint with one tracking number to better maintain and collect data on complaints.












# **Accidents**


- The total number of Officer Involved Accidents for 2020 is 223.




## 2020 Top 5 Causes of Accidents.









# **Pursuits**

- 16% of the pursuits were determined to be not justified (23 total).


